RATIONALE

- The setting of extended learning provides students with the opportunity to consolidate and extend the learning that takes place at school.
- It involves parents in their child's learning and strengthens the home/school partnership.
- Extended learning tasks help to develop our personal learning and thinking skills such as independent enquiry, self-management and creative thinking.
- It helps pupils to develop perseverance and self-discipline and this helps the development of confidence to deal with frustrations and overcome problems.

Extended Learning will:

- be stimulating and challenging
- consolidate and extend work covered during lessons
- prepare for new learning
- develop research skills
- provide opportunities for independent study, including choices of presentation
- enhance study skills of planning, time management and self-discipline
- encourage students to take ownership and responsibility for their own learning
- engage parental cooperation and support
- prepare students for tests and exams

Students will:

- recognise the value of Extended Learning in improving learning
- complete tasks to the best of their ability, taking pride in content and presentation
- endeavour to meet all deadlines

- organise their own independent study time
- use their go4schools page and planner to help organise and keep to deadlines
- seek appropriate support when necessary
- record all tasks and deadlines in their planners
- involve parents/carers when appropriate

Parents are asked to:

- check planners and go4schools for details of Extended Learning set
- support their children in organising their time to meet deadlines
- try to provide suitable working conditions
- take an active interest in their child's Extended Learning in terms of its content and quality
- give help, if required, but not so that it becomes the parents' work
- be aware of any task(s) causing undue stress and contact the college (through the form tutor in the first instance)

Teachers will:

- set extended learning according to the College policy and record on go4schools
- ensure tasks are clearly stated and understood by all students
- set tasks appropriate for all abilities
- set clear, realistic deadlines (not set for the next day)
- set high expectations of content and presentation when appropriate
- monitor the quality of the Extended Learning and provide summative or formative feedback when appropriate

Extended learning tasks may be:

- the practice of skills learned during lessons
- an extended project
- background reading
- research
- reading of a text for future discussion
- collecting items
- private reading
- extension of skills learned during lessons
- specific revision tasks for tests or exams
- watching/listening to forms of media related to a topic
- visiting local areas
- creating visual aids
- interviewing friends/family
