Advent Assessment Information

At De Lisle, students have key formal assessments on two occasions during the academic year. The assessment windows take place at the following times:

Advent Term—14 November – 9 December Pentecost Term— 5 June – 23 June

Formal assessment can look very different in each subject, and that is why we are providing you and your child with the information in this booklet so that you can better understand what these assessments will look like, when they will take place and most importantly, how best to revise and prepare. We hope you find this information useful, and we encourage you to discuss this document with your child so that they can plan their preparation for these assessments. Evidence has shown that

These formal assessments are not just about getting a grade. We want students to engage closely with feedback, thinking 'what do I know well?' and 'what do I now need to do to improve?'. By thinking in this way, it will help them to develop their knowledge in the longer term. To aid this process, students will be provided with question level analysis (QLA) feedback.

Outlined below is guidance on what will be covered in each subject. Please contact your child's subject teacher if you need further help. On our website you will find pages for each subject listing the same guidance and providing links to the supporting resources. You can also find here an outline of the curriculum for the year in each subject.

Following the conclusion of these assessments, parents will receive a summary report of students' performance at the end of the term. This will be in the format of an online report on go4schools. On go4schools throughout the year you can also find further information on students' performance in lower stakes assessments in each subject.

The table below summarises which week the assessments will take place in each subject. The class teacher will inform the child of the exact lesson(s) in which the assessment will be and this should be recorded on Show My Homework.

Key Stage 3 Grading System

In Key Stage 3 at De Lisle, students' attainment will be determined by a standardised scoring system. Each assessment will provide a 'raw score', that is their score out of a given total on the assessment. A statistical process is used to convert the raw score into a standardised score for each student. Standardised scores range from 1-100, and indicate the position of each student with the year group.

Students will no longer be graded on a 9-1 scale. Now the standardised score will be used to assign a quintile grade to each student with the highest grade now being a 5 which indicates they are in the top 20% of the year group. The full details are explained in this table:

Grade	Standardised Score	Rank Position in Year at De Lisle	
5	80 - 100	In the top 20% of students	
4	60 - 80	In the top 40% of students	
3	40 - 60	In the middle 20% of students	
2	20 - 40	In the lowest 40% of students	
1	1 – 20	In the lowest 20% of students	


The advantages of using the standardised scoring system are:


- > It provides a clear picture of how your child is performing in each subject compared to their peers.
- > It allows your child to track their progress in each subject across the year and through Key Stage 3 more closely.
- > It allows for comparisons of your child's performance to be made between subjects.

At each of the two assessment points your child will be provided with their grade and standardised score in each subject. On Go4schools, your child's page will now show you an attainment chart. This will easily allow you to see how they have performed across their different subjects based on their 5-1 grades.

Each student has been assigned a Prior Attainment Grade. This grade provides an indicator as to where your child was positioned in the year group at the end of Key Stage 2. It is based on a combined score of their maths and English.

In this Advent assessment I will be asked to show I can...

- Recall key knowledge from the Anglo Saxon knowledge organiser.
- Demonstrate I understand why some people believed Anglo-Saxon England to be a 'Dark Age' characterised by bloodthirsty Vikings.
- Illustrate how I understand the role early Christianity had on changing England.
- Use the lives of Alfred the Great and his daughter Aethelflaed prove England was advancing as a country.
- Construct an essay to answer the question 'Should the Dark Ages be called the Dark Ages?"
- We will be looking for the following features:
- An introduction which: explains the question, and makes an argument.
- Paragraphs which answer the question (A.T.Q) in the first and last sentence.
- Paragraphs which stick to the point (S.T.P).
- A conclusion which powerfully restates your argument.
- Detail which is relevant, specific and accurate.
- Lots of explanation developing that detail 'so what?'
- Accurate spelling check your work.
- Accurate punctuation and grammar check your work.
- Sentences which are short, clear and make sense.
- Sustained judgement throughout your essay.

You will sit **three assessment papers** in the Advent term. Each assessment will be of equal challenge but they will progress in difficulty through the paper. They will test you on your understanding of the concepts studied so far in Year 7 which build upon your study in primary school. The **core concepts** you will be tested on are listed below, but this is not an exclusive list as questions may draw on any content we have covered so far in Year 7.

Unit 1 – Sequences Core Concepts

- Predict and check the next term(s) of a sequence
- Recognise the difference between linear and non-linear sequences
- Continue numerical linear sequences
- Continue numerical non-linear sequences

Unit 2 – Algebraic Notation Core Concepts

- Given a numerical input find the output of a single function machine
- Use inverse operations to find the input given the output
- Find the function machine given a simple expression
- Find numerical inputs and outputs for a series of two function machines
- Substitute values into two-step expressions
- Generate sequences given an algebraic rule

Unit 3 – Equality & Equivalence Core Concepts

- Solve one-step linear equations involving + or -
- Solve one-step equations involving x or ÷
- Understand the meaning of like and unlike terms
- Simplify algebraic expressions by collecting like terms

Unit 4 - Place Value & Ordering Integers and Decimals Core Concepts

- Recognise the place value of any integer up to one billion
- Round integers to the nearest power of ten
- Compare two numbers using =. ≠, <, >, ≤, ≥
- Understand place value for decimals
- Position decimals on a number line
- Round a number to one significant figure



Unit 5 – Fraction, Percentage & Decimal Equivalence Core Concepts

- Convert between fractions & decimals- tenths and hundredths
- Convert between fractions and decimals fifths and quarters
- Convert between fractions and decimals eighths and thousandths

What should I do to revise and prepare for this assessment?

To prepare for this assessment:

- Look at the results from your knowledge checks which are recorded at the back of each of your workbooks and also on go4schools. Look to see which small steps you dropped marks on. Re-watch the lesson videos available on the school website and revisit the questions on these topics in your workbook. Focus in particular on any small steps which are listed as core concepts above.
- 2. **Complete your revision workbook** that your teacher has provided you. You should work through all the questions in your revision workbook, checking your work using the answers provided. You could ask your parent or relative to check your work with you, and discuss the areas you need to revisit. This revision workbook must be completed in full and handed in to your teacher for checking the day of your first assessment.
- 3. **Read carefully through your lesson notes** in each workbook. Look out for the key information that you have written down or highlighted that your teacher said was an important learning point.
- 4. **Study the knowledge organisers** for the units being tested. They can be found at the back of each of the workbooks that you have completed so far. You should use the technique of **'look, cover, check'** to ensure you can recall all of the key facts and techniques.
- 5. Listen attentively during your Immersion Revision Session which will take place the week before your assessment. Your teacher will provide you with a number of key tips to help you succeed. They will revisit the core concepts listed above.
