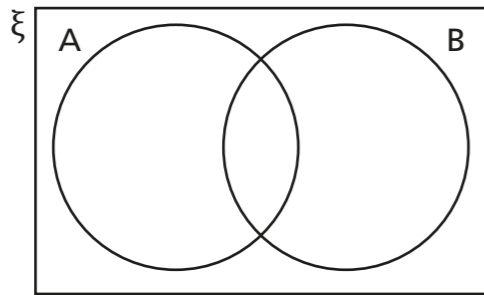


# Understand and use the union of sets

- b) Describe what  $A \cup B$  means.

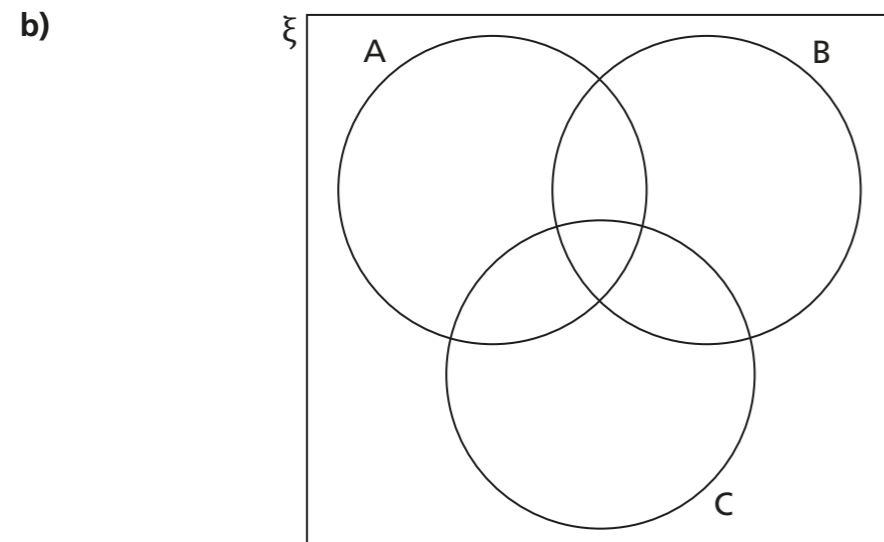
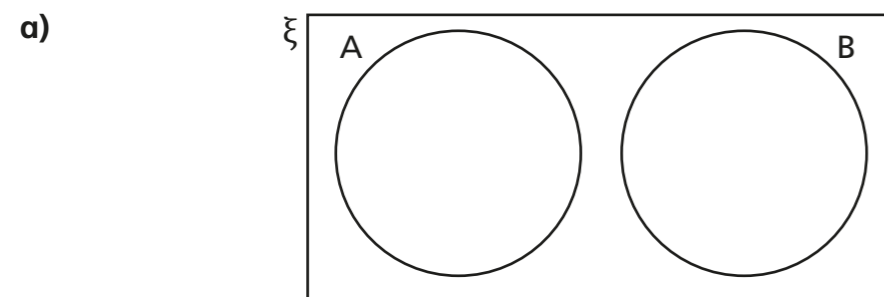
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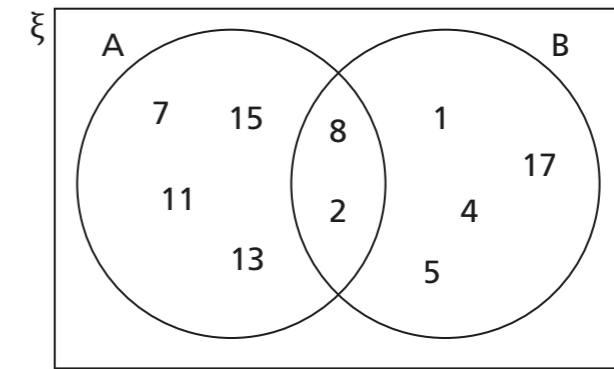

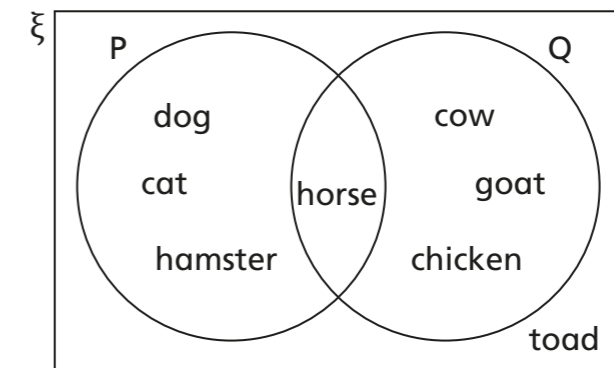

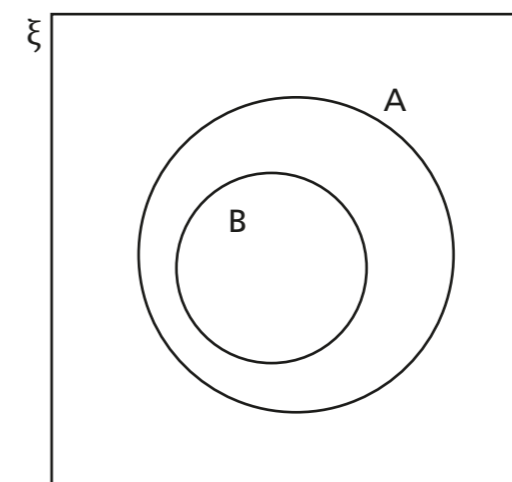
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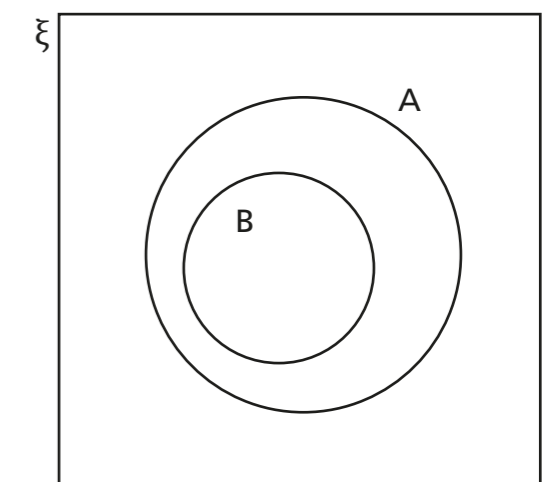

$$A \cap B = \{-2, 3, 8, 11\}$$

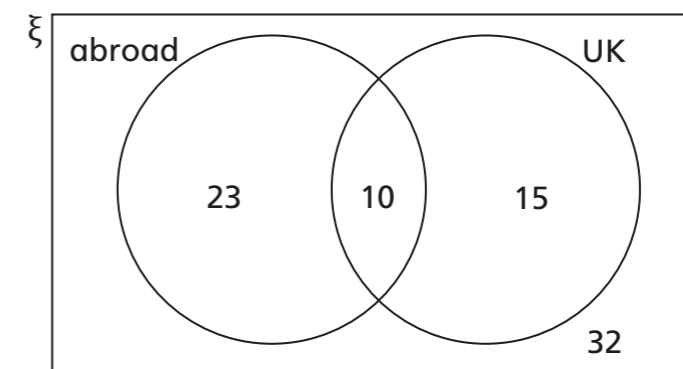
$$A \cup B = \{-2, -1, 1, 3, 5, 8, 10, 11, 15\}$$

- 7 80 families were asked if they went on holiday abroad or in the UK.

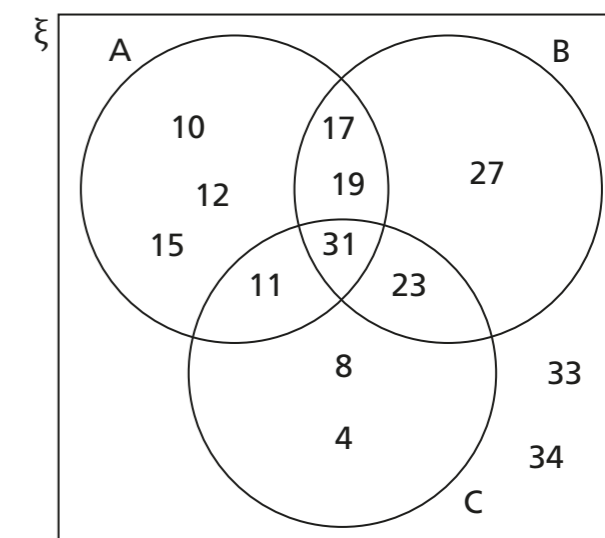
