- We will be looking at how you can write detailed paragraphs with clear topic sentences
- Can you use because, specifically, almost as though to expand your analysis
- Do you know WHY writers have created certain effects? E.g. Perhaps Priestley wanted to teach the audience.... or criticise....
- Can you embed and contextualise quotations?

Knowing your texts well cannot be underestimated. Without knowing the stories and events in detail, you cannot write an effective response. If nothing else, make sure you know the events, characters and ideas in An Inspector Calls and AS Christmas Carol.

What should I do to revise and prepare for this assessment?

To prepare for this literature assessment:

- 1. Reread your set text: An Inspector Calls and A Christmas Carol
- 2. Complete Educake quizzes about the texts
- 3. Use GCSEpod and Massolit to watch key videos (You can sign in using your Office365 details)
- 4. Create flashcards to revisit key information from each text/ poem
- 6. Look at the attached An Inspector Calls and A Christmas Carol sample questions. For each, think about what details from the story you would focus on to answer the question.

To prepare for this language assessment:

Use your yellow exercise books and the Pushy Parents/ Poaching articles and feedback to guide your revision.

- 1. We will be spending 2 lessons the first week back after half term looking at a past paper and doing a walking, talking mock. Use this to guide your revision.

Paper 1 Medicine Through time:

Be able to answer short and long essay style questions Explaining how medicine changed or stayed the same in the following periods:

c1250–c1500: Medicine in medieval England:

c1500–c1700: The Medical Renaissance in England:

c1700-c1900: Medicine in eighteenth- and nineteenth-century Britain

c1900-present: Medicine in modern Britain

You must be able to consider both changes in Cause, Prevention and treatment, as well as the importance of different factors such as education, key individuals, government, science and technology.

You need to be able to answer source questions on battlefield medicine on the western front. Including developments in treatments, wounds caused by the weapons, illnesses caused by conditions and the evacuation process.

Paper 2a Anglo Saxon and Norman England:

You need to be able to describe and explain changes and events in the period 1060-188 including the following key areas:

Saxon England 1060-66

1066 including the succession crisis, the Battles of Fulford Gate, Stamford Bridge and Hastings.

1067-1075 William securing control. Including the rebellions of Edwin and Morcar, Edgar Atheling, Hereward the Wake and the rebellion of the Earls.

1075-1088 Norman England including changes to the law, land, society, church and Williams family.

You will need to make business decisions and apply your knowledge to case studies and situations to make wise business decisions that weigh the advantages and disadvantages. Ensuring you answer the questions with logical reasoning based on your analysis. You will need to include application of real-world examples when possible, using case studies to demonstrate how business ideas/answers relate to the actual businesses.

You will need to prepare for all these topics because each of these areas examines a combination of knowledge, application, analysis, and evaluation skills

What should I do to revise and prepare for this assessment?

Multiple choice questions, plus a combination of short and long essays 12-marks max
