### In this Advent assessment I will be asked to show I can...

#### Literature

3 Sections: A Christmas Carol/An Inspector Calls/Unseen Poetry

- You will be set a question about A Christmas Carol. This will be an extract and whole text question.
- You will be set a question about An Inspector Calls. You will have a choice of 2, but you only write about one.
- You will be set a question about Unseen Poetry. You will answer a question to analyse a poem and you will answer a question to compare this poem with a second poem on the unseen paper.
- We will be looking at how you can write detailed paragraphs with clear topic sentences:
- Can you use because, specifically, almost as though to expand your analysis
- Do you know WHY writers have created certain effects? E.g. Perhaps Priestley wanted to teach the audience.... or criticise....
- Can you embed and contextualise quotations? Knowing your texts well cannot be underestimated. Without knowing the stories and events in detail, you cannot write an effective response. If nothing else, make sure you know the events, characters and ideas in An Inspector Calls and A Christmas Carol.

1. Reread your set texts: An Inspector Calls, A Christmas Carol and Unseen Poetry

4. Create flashcards to revisit key information from each text/ poem
5. Use past papers to plan and complete answers to the essay questions
