Show knowledge and understanding on everything you we have covered for paper 1 as we have fully completed all of the topics on paper 1. There will be a variety of questions as the paper consists of six sections. Students must answer all questions in each section. The first five sections will contain multiple-choice, short-open and open-response questions. The sixth section will contain two extended open-response questions. These questions will focus on issues and debates within psychology and the interrelationships between the core areas of psychology.

The only topic which will not be assessed will be the development topic as this is the topic we have only just started.

- Memory How does your memory work?
- Psychological problems How would psychological problems affect you?
- The brain and neuropsychology How does your brain affect you?
- Social influence How do others affect you?
- Research methods How do you carry out psychological research?

Please note there will be an extended question (9 marker(s)) to answer in the <u>assessment.</u>
